Candidates please give your answer to each of the following questions and <u>include</u> <u>your</u> rationale with each answer. Please be concise and clear.

- Why are you running for School Board Trustee? Is there a particular issue that motivates you to serve on the school board? If elected, what will be your priorities?
  Answer: I'm running for CFISD Trustee to be a voice for the students and teachers at our school district. Recently, I learned that only 59% of the district's 3rd graders are reading at grade level. We can do better. My priorities will be many. Improving student outcomes, empowering parents and supporting teachers are just a few of my priorities if elected.
- What experience or skills have prepared you to serve as a board member? What differentiates you from the other candidates and/or board members? In what school district or community activities/organizations have you been involved?

Answer: I have over two decades of experience in building small businesses and teams from scratch. I know what it takes to build successful teams. I am a problem finder and solutions provider. Having the heart of a teacher along with my ability to connect with community members from many different backgrounds makes me the best candidate. In addition to coaching select baseball teams for over 10 seasons, I helped create Texas Civic Alliance, a conservative Christian organization, that recruits people that share our values to volunteer in schools to help students and staff members. Volunteering as a bus buddy the last two years, participating in the CFISD mentorship program and helping coach the Cy Park varsity baseball team for KCF summer and fall seasons are a few of the activities I am currently or recently been involved with.

3. What are your thoughts on the current and the proposed budget for your school district? Is the current funding allocation within district spending categories adequate between administration, facilities, teachers, etc.?

**Answer**: We need an increase in funding at the state level. Currently the basic allotment sits at \$6160 per student without an increase since 2019. I will work with the experts within the school district (and outside the school district) to identify areas where costs can be cut or should be increased. In my opinion, there should be better funding for reading and math programs in addition to more funding for our teachers and students.

4. What are your areas of concern regarding student achievement in your district? Do you have specific suggestions for improvement? What is your long-term strategy or strategies for improving the quality of education and keeping pace with student growth within the district?

**Answer**: We need to get back to basics. I understand that CFISD has dealt with numerous obstacles and distractions the past few years but having just 59% of our 3rd graders currently reading at grade level is not acceptable. I will seek counsel from current and retired teachers to offer solutions to increase reading comprehension and test scores for our students. Relying on feedback from committees of current and retired teachers to offer solutions to the issues at hand will be a priority.

- 5. Is teacher performance adequate within your district? What type of teacher evaluation system and administrator evaluation system do you support? Are the teacher's salaries adequate given the current state budget condition?
  Answer: Performance has been good with the current situations and getting past the lockdowns. I would rely on a committee of current and former teachers/administrators to come up with a fair evaluation system district wide. I will always advocate for the highest possible compensation for our teachers. We need an increase in the basic allotment at the state level.
- 6. Should DEI be included in school curriculum and library Books? Should Homeschool students be allowed to use publicly funded facilities and equipment?

Answer: The definition of DEI refers to organizational frameworks which seek to promote "the fair treatment and full participation of all people". Texas law requires that ALL curriculum be based upon the same standards (TEKS). In CFISD all kids have equal access to the curriculum. All kids can access books in the library with parent/guardian approval. DEI as a social construct should be taught by parents, not teachers. I don't have a problem with Homeschool students using publicly funded facilities or equipment if they pay CFISD school taxes. I would defer to the CFISD legal team concerning insurance waivers for each participant.
