Candidates please give your answer to each of the following questions and <u>include</u> <u>your</u> rationale with each answer. Please be concise and clear.

1. Why are you running for City Council? If elected, what will be your priorities?

Answer: I am running because I am concerned about the direction District I has been going. I am concerned about the crime in our city, flooding, infrastructure and wasteful spending. It has been reported that at the conclusion of the bike lanes plan, the cost will be approximately \$500 million. This is outrageous. I have not talked to one resident of District I who thinks the bike lanes are a good idea. Elderly citizens have damaged their vehicles due to confusion of the bike lanes. The bike lanes are seldom utilized. Children never utilize the bike lanes due to being too dangerous. Removing two vehicular lanes to construct two bike lanes (one each direction) is not a very intelligent plan.

Crime in this city is high. Citizens are afraid to go shopping, gas up their vehicles and go to the bank without having to look over their back. This is not the way to live. Patrol vehicles are rarely seen in neighborhoods due to the shortage of officers, however if the officers assigned to non-police functions are reassigned to patrol, may alleviate officer shortage.

The city collects drainage fees from property owners, however they have ignored many areas in District I where flooding often occurs.

The streets are in need of repair. The dollars spent on the bike lanes should be utilized to fix and repair the street. Our city infrastructure has been ignored or set aside for other city projects. This is unacceptable.

The city must stop wasteful spending and be transparent with the tax paying citizens.

What experience or skills have prepared you to serve as a city council member? What differentiates you from the other candidates and/or council members?

First of all, I care about the citizens of this city regardless of the district they reside in. I am a retired Houston Police Officer of 30 years. My entire career has been addressing issues and concerns of residents mainly in District I. I am very familiar with the citizens and small business owners in District I. During my career with the Houston Police Department I was assigned to many assignments such as patrol, truancy unit, inhalant abuse unit, gang unit, community service unit, differential response team, neighborhood protection and homeland security at both Houston Airports. I have a vast amount of experience addressing many critical and dangerous situations. I have worked during Hurricanes and flooding on several occasions. I have abated blight and graffiti, cleaned under bridges of debris and trash, enforced illegal dumping, arrested many felons for murder, robbery, burglary, auto theft, domestic violence, narcotics, ect. My vast amount of experience cannot be matched by my opponent. I will not ignore the citizens of the district I, like the present administration has. I will be the voice of the citizens and fight for concerns. Working with the citizens is not new to me.
