Candidates please give your answer to each of the following questions and include your rationale with each answer. Please be concise and clear.

1. Why are you running for City Council? If elected, what will be your priorities?

Answer: I love Houston! I am a Yale University graduate and the managing partner of Garcia Hamilton & Associates and former chairman of the Metropolitan Transit Authority of Harris County (METRO). Under my leadership, GH&A has increased the amount of fixed-income assets it manages from \$200 million to almost \$22 billion. At METRO, we balanced the budget, increased transparency, experienced labor peace, expanded light rail, re-did the entire bus network, revamped the procurement process, all earning us Transit Agency of the Year in 2015. I have served as a lead voice to the SEC to develop policies to increase transparency and address the wealth inequality that exists in America. This includes working with SEC Commissioners and testifying before various committees including the US Senate. If elected, I'll apply that value and experience in my role as Mayor. I think my experience building teams and running a billion-dollar business is an important skill I can bring to the City of Houston. I have released a pledge to Houston which outlines the actions that I would take during my first 100 days as Mayor. I have attached my pledge.
2. What experience or skills have prepared you to serve as a city council member? What differentiates you from the other candidates and/or council members?

Answer: My background as a financial expert and experience balancing the budget and leading METRO make me qualified to be Mayor. Financial expertise is crucial for managing Houston's budget, handling the City's pensions properly and ensuring financial stability. I am not a career politician. Additionally, being an outsider with no financial interests from the city. I can bring a fresh perspective and reduce conflicts of interest. I can make the tough calls to make the city better and ensure our government is transparent and held accountable to maintain the public trust.

3. What is the effectiveness of the current system for City of Houston residents to report issues/file complaints? How can this system be improved to better serve residents?

Answer: The current system is not effective for residents to report issues or file complaints. In my administration transparency will be a key component. The 311 system is outdated and needs a complete overhaul. The system is not working and must be fixed. It is impossible to speak to anyone in the city and this must change!
