Dr. Jack Christie

Dr. Jack Christie is a native Texan, businessman, chiropractic physician, and community leader. His vast background has allowed him to interact with residents and understand the needs of Houston's numerous and richly diverse neighborhoods. He proudly served the *City of Houston as At-Large Position 5 Councilmember*. In his *22 years of elected public service*, *Christie has won 15 elections* during which time he's represented his constituents every day. Currently, he oversees a successful Houston area practice that cares for more than 35,000 patients.

After finishing pre-med sciences at San Jacinto College, Christie received his Doctor of Chiropractic degree from Texas Chiropractic College. Soon after, he served in the Army Reserves Medical Corps for six years. Following the Corps, he received a certificate in International Relations upon completion of graduate courses at the Bush School of Government at Texas A&M.

Additionally, he took numerous graduate classes at the University of St. Thomas, graduate travelling courses at the University of Texas/Cambridge England, night sundry courses at Rice University, auditing courses at the University of Houston, and Harvard University Business School's Summer Course. These courses and certification prepared him to engage with dignitaries and enhance relationships on behalf of the City of Houston. He's traveled to over 50 countries and to every state in the US.

As a dedicated *small business owner for over 50 years*, Christie began advising members of the local business community when he served on the Board of Directors for the Spring Branch-Memorial Chamber of Commerce (now West Houston Chamber of Commerce).

Prior to being elected to Houston City Council, Christie's previous elected positions include three terms as a member of both the Spring Branch Independent School District Board of Trustees and the State Board of Education. When he was President of SBISD Board of Trustees, the board was recognized as the most outstanding school board in Texas. While Chairman of the State Board of Education, he directed a team that raised high school standards in all 15 required subject areas, followed by a strong testing and accountability system, preparing kids for the 21st century workforce.

Christie's background in science and education has made him a *sought-after education and technology expert*. He has appeared on the NBC Today Show, ABC World News Tonight, CNN, and CNN Money. He has also been quoted in *The Wall Street Journal* and *New York Times*, as well as *Time*, *Fortune*, *and Wired* magazines. In 2000, after being selected from a pool of nominees by the state's premier scientists, Dr. Jack Christie was inducted into the Texas Science Hall of Fame.

While an accomplished businessman and recognized by his achievements, Christie is most clearly defined by his unrelenting *drive to serve his community*. Christie organizes and sponsors the annual 5th Ward Ice Skating Party, an event he founded and created 35 years ago. He served on Big Brothers Big Sisters of Greater Houston Board of Directors for five years; volunteered as a Big Brother for eight years, and has had the unparalleled privilege of watching his "little brothers" grow into successful and self-assured adults. He also is active in Young Life as a volunteer, and attends church every Sunday.

Christie is the proud father of John, Katherine, and Patrick. He is an Eagle Scout, and has been an avid runner for more than 45 years, competing and finishing marathons and the Ironman Triathlon in Hawaii.
