1. Why are you running for Mayor? Ife elected, what will be your priorities?

Answer:

My late father was a small businessman; my mother worked part-time at Neiman-Marcus. My dad's constant admonition still resonates with me every day: "If it's worth doing, it's worth doing right." And my mother's intelligence, warmth, and compassion taught me the importance of recognizing the contributions of others. I take what I learned from my parents to heart as I run for Mayor of Houston. I will tackle the thorny issues that frustrate Houstonians every day: crime, infrastructure and traffic, garbage pickup, and the maddening difficulty of dealing with the City bureaucracy. I'll tackle these problems head-on and make progress to help our City move forward. I don't promise to "solve" these problems overnight or "fix" them forever. But I won't get distracted by petty arguments or rhetorical disputes as we focus on what needs to get done. I will strive to be a Mayor who does things right, a Mayor you can be proud of, and a Mayor who focuses on the essential services that impact all of us every single day.

2. What experience or skills have prepared you to serve as Mayor? What differentiates you from the other candidates and/or council members?

Answer:

I am a small business owner. We have grown from three attorneys to a firm that employs 50 people. I know what it takes to run a business that has to meet a payroll every pay period. And I know how important it is to take the views of everyone at the firm to heart to make sure we are making the right decisions for everyone. We are known for competence, accountability, and integrity. I believe this approach and these qualities apply equally to the Mayor's office.

I have been an active participant in civic life. From my leadership positions with the Texas Aerospace Commission and Bar associations to my volunteer position as adult leader (Assistant Scoutmaster) with Troop 212 sponsored by St. James Episcopal Church at 3129 Southmore and volunteer for Big Brothers/Big Sisters and Meals on Wheels, I have given back to our community. And not to run for political office. Because it was the right thing to do.

I am not running for Mayor to advance a political career. I am not a political insider and am not beholden to anyone. I just want to be the best mayor for the people of Houston because I love our city and want it to be the best it can be.

3. What is the effectiveness of the current system for City of Houston residents to report issues/file complaints? How can this system be improved to better serve residents?

Answer:

Dealing with the city's bureaucracy is maddening and fixing it will be one of my top priorities as Mayor. The first thing we need to do is appoint people to important positions based on merit, not as political favors.

The second part is to hold these employees accountable for providing the residents of Houston with quality customer service.
